

#### WOMEN IN LEADERSHIP A CENTURY APART

A major AAUW focus is to close the gender leadership gap. In our newsletter, we will be highlighting women leaders in our region – past and present.

In this issue, we are featuring two leaders -both in the role of Placer County Superintendent of Schools. While serving as Superintendent - 100+ years apart - both Irene Burns and today's Superintendent, Gayle Garbolino-Mojica have demonstrated a determination to serve - and lead - the community.

## Irene Burns - First Female Placer County Superintendent of Schools

Women in California won the right to vote in 1911 -- nine years before the 19th amendment was ratified nationally. Shortly after that, in 1914, Irene Burns, of Auburn, ran for Placer County Superintendent of Schools – and won - making her the first female in that role and the first female in Placer County to hold any elected office. She served three terms.



#### WOMEN IN LEADERSHIP A CENTURY APART

The National Register of Historic Places application form for Irene Burns' Auburn home, states she, "Represents an individual significant for her role as an educator and administrator in Placer County, California. As a woman of the Progressive Era, Irene Burns represented part of a generation of women with expanded opportunities for education and political voice.

Her Plaque is also in Auburn near Sara Jane's Plaque. Irene is noted as also being one of the first women to drive an automobile in Auburn. CA.

## Gayle Garbolino-Mojica - Today's Placer County Superintendent of Schools

Gayle Garbolino-Mojica was elected to Placer County Superintendent of Schools in 2006 and is currently serving her 4th term. Ms. Garbolino-Mojica is a graduate of the University of California, Davis.

She received her teaching credential from Cal Poly San Luis Obispo and an Administrative Credential and master's degree in Educational Administration and Leadership from California State University, Sacramento. Ms. Garbolino-Mojica was a teacher, assistant principal and program specialist with the Western Placer Unified School District, and principal and subsequently superintendent of the Colfax Elementary School District.

We asked Gayle to share her thinking on three questions.

Q: What is one lesson learned that's unique to being a woman leader?

I find common characteristics in women leaders – we tend to be smart, precise, hardworking, and collaborative.

## Q. What advice would you give aspiring female executives?


I would advise all aspiring women seeking a professional or executive position to find a woman that they can model themselves after and possibly have them become your mentor. There is definitely an "art" to a female leadership and seeking out women who are successful in their respective roles, and learning from them, is key.

#### Q. Name a woman who has inspired you?

The woman who has inspired me the most is my mother, Gina Garbolino. My mom became involved in our community when my dad first ran for judge in Placer County decades ago. She continued her service years later by serving as a council member and Mayor on the Roseville City Council. Seeing her in her element as a responsive and caring proponent of good governance who had a genuine love for her community was truly inspirational for me when I ran for Placer County Superintendent of Schools.

- ♦ Your name will appear on the outside of your directory along with a number. The number is the member number that National AAUW has assigned you.
- ♦ There are certain areas that are shaded. The shading represents changes made since last year's directory was distributed.

#### **GUBERNATORIAL RECALL ELECTION COMING**

#### Recall Election Facts:

- ⇒ You may always vote for a replacement candidate, even if you vote no on the recall.
- ⇒ All registered California voters will receive a ballot in the mail.
- ⇒ Mail-in ballots must be postmarked by **September 14**, election day. *Postage is already paid—you don't need a stamp!*
- ⇒ **August 30** is the last day to <u>register to vote</u> and receive a mail-in ballot. *If you register after that date, you must vote in person.*
- ⇒ The election is <u>expected to be close</u> and will likely be decided by voter turnout. **Your vote** counts!

#### **Update on the Gubernatorial Recall**

The Recall Election is going to be a nail biter. Even though registered Democrats far outnumber registered Republicans in California, Republicans are highly motivated to make a dramatic statement with this election.

Complicating the situation is that 46 candidates filed all the paperwork necessary by the July 16 deadline to run in the Sept. 14 election. This large field includes GOP politicians, a reality TV personality, a YouTuber, several business owners, and several single-issue advocates.

As a reminder, the ballot has two parts. The first part asks whether Governor Newsom should be recalled, and you can vote "yes" or "no." If a majority of the voters vote "yes" on the first question, then Governor Newsom will no longer be Governor. In the second part of the ballot, you can select a replacement candidate

Note that – if the current governor is recalled – the person who becomes our next governor will probably receive only a very small number of votes. The reason for such an outcome is that there are so many people vying for the position. Also, the leading GOP candidate, Larry Elder, has turned out to have some significant skeletons in his closet, which will depress his showing. The Republican Party has not endorsed any of the candidates.

This election will be watched by people all over the world, and the consequences could change the course of California politics.
