In February, our president, Deb Sabo, signed the Memos of Understanding (MOU) to AAUW CA. This is our branch's commitment to pay for the camper slots we requested so Camps have a budget to work with to put together this year's camp. Our branch committed to 6 residential slots at UC Davis camp and 3 Virtual camper slots for Virtual Camp.

Auburn AAUW received around 2 camper nominations from each of 7 area schools. Nominated girls are working on their Camper Applications and will be interviewed for final selection in mid-March.

Dates for campers from Auburn AAUW is July 14 to July 20 at UC Davis. Visitors' Day to UCD Camp will likely be Thursday, July 18, 2024.

We have a pivotal year in Public Policy!

We have 3 students participating in Gov Trek, a new program for Junior and Senior high school girls to learn about careers in public service and elected office. They are investing 7 Saturdays this spring to engage on issues that matter, such as gun control, climate change, and voting equality. They are meeting women changemakers in politics, and they will work in teams to create a campaign simulation. They will opt to be a candidate, a campaign manager, speechwriter, communications director, or field and volunteer manager. What a great experience!

As we go to press, we are in the final planning stages for our Second Annual Speech Trek. This is a terrific opportunity for all high school students to practice public speaking skills. It is true what you've heard: almost everyone would rather die than do public speaking! These students are already winners because they will be light years ahead of their peers during job negotiations, work presentations, and interpersonal communications.

Next up on our agenda are Lobby Days, where we travel to Sacramento and meet with our elected representatives in person to talk about pending legislation that affects women, children, and families. The training for this event is March 25, and the days in Sacramento will be April 2 and 3. Stay tuned to find out which bills we are going to discuss.
