It offers rising 8th grade girls a once-in-a-lifetime opportunity to explore STEM topics with women role models and to possibly envision a future for themselves in it. Tech Trek is now a nationwide program, organized through AAUW.

There were nine camps in California this year, plus ten camps in other states. For more than 25 years, Tech Trek has opened the eyes of more than 15,000 girls to new worlds and the camaraderie of like-minded campers interested in STEM. AAUW branch members visit middle schools in the fall of every school year to work with science and math teachers to recruit candidates.
